Subject: Introduction of PAC Members

Discussion: As the group has been together for a few years now, there was less of an introduction and more of a catching up with each other. All members said that they and their families were all safe and doing well. All members said that business was better than they expected.

Subject: Review of spring 2020 minutes

Discussion: The board discussed and accepted the meeting minutes from the fall PAC meeting

Subject: Student enrollment/placement for class of 2023

Discussion: Tim Graham told the board that there were 18 students in the Sophomore Landscape class. The board was happy class size. The board then reiterated that they continue to think that last year's lower than average draw was just a fluke. Jack then spoke and told the board that almost half of the senior class was in co-op. He then spoke about how he was continuing to make this a priority in his teaching as he wants the students to get the first hand experience of the industry. The board continues to believe in the teachers and the strong industry outlook.

Subject: Remote Learning

Discussion: The board discussed remote learning. They spoke of how impressed they were with what they had heard about how effectively Essex Tech had implemented this Falls remote learning. Jack and Tim each took turns discussing what specifics about what they had been doing with each of their classes. They both spoke of how most of the students were receptive and some were not, but how that was similar to a traditional school day as well. They both spoke of how they were getting creative with their lessons as this time of year they would traditionally be
